

[Heb 11:20 NASB] By faith Isaac blessed Jacob and Esau, even regarding things to come.

- [Gen 25:21 NASB] Isaac prayed to the LORD on behalf of his wife, because she was barren; and the LORD answered him and Rebekah his wife conceived.
- [Gen 25:22 NASB] But the children struggled together within her; and she said, "If it is so, why then am I [this way?]" So she went to inquire of the LORD.
- [Gen 25:23 NASB] The LORD said to her, "Two nations are in your womb; And two peoples will be separated from your body; And one people shall be stronger than the other; **And the older shall serve the younger.**"

The Blessing – Isaac did not change the blessing

[Gen 27:28-29 NASB] Now may God give you of the dew of heaven, And of the fatness of the earth, And an abundance of grain and new wine; May peoples serve you, And nations bow down to you; **Be master of your brothers, And may your mother's sons bow down to you.** Cursed be those who curse you, And blessed be those who bless you."

- [Gen 28:1-4 NASB] So Isaac called Jacob and blessed him and charged him, and said to him, "You shall not take a wife from the daughters of Canaan. "Arise, go to Paddan-aram, to the house of Bethuel your mother's father; and from there take to yourself a wife from the daughters of Laban your mother's brother. "May God Almighty bless you and make you fruitful and multiply you, that you may become a company of peoples. "May He also give you the blessing of Abraham, to you and to your descendants with you, that you may possess the land of your sojournings, which God gave to Abraham."
- [Gen 28:5 NASB] Then Isaac sent Jacob away, and he went to Paddan-aram to Laban, son of Bethuel the Aramean, the brother of Rebekah, the mother of Jacob and Esau.

[Heb 11:21 NASB] By faith Jacob, as he was dying, blessed each of the sons of Joseph, and worshiped, [leaning] on the top of his staff.

- [Gen 47:29 NASB] When the time for Israel to die drew near, he called his son Joseph and said to him, "Please, if I have found favor in your sight, place now your hand under my thigh and deal with me in kindness and faithfulness. Please do not bury me in Egypt,
- [Gen 47:30 NASB] but when I lie down with my fathers, you shall carry me out of Egypt and bury me in their burial place." And he said, "I will do as you have said."
- [Gen 48:16 NASB] The angel who has redeemed me from all evil, Bless the lads; And may my name live on in them, And the names of my fathers Abraham and Isaac; And may they grow into a multitude in the midst of the earth." When Joseph

saw that his father laid his right hand on Ephraim's head, it displeased him; and he grasped his father's hand to remove it from Ephraim's head to Manasseh's head.

- [Gen 48:18 NASB] Joseph said to his father, "Not so, my father, for this one is the firstborn. Place your right hand on his head." But his father refused and said, "I know, my son, I know; he also will become a people and he also will be great. However, his younger brother shall be greater than he, and his descendants shall become a multitude of nations."

[Heb 11:22 NASB] By faith Joseph, when he was dying, made mention of the exodus of the sons of Israel, and gave orders concerning his bones.

- [Gen 48:21 NASB] Then Israel said to Joseph, "Behold, I am about to die, but God will be with you, and bring you back to the land of your fathers."
- [Gen 50:24 NASB] Joseph said to his brothers, "I am about to die, but **God will surely take care of you and bring you up from this land to the land which He promised on oath to Abraham, to Isaac and to Jacob.**"
- [Gen 50:25-26 NASB] Then Joseph made the sons of Israel swear, saying, "God will surely take care of you, and you shall carry my bones up from here." So Joseph died at the age of one hundred and ten years; and he was embalmed and placed in a coffin in Egypt.
- [Heb 11:13 NASB] All these died in faith, without receiving the promises, but having seen them and having welcomed them from a distance, and having confessed that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. And all these, having gained approval through their faith, did not receive what was promised,
- [Heb 11:40 NASB] because God had provided something better for us, so that apart from us they would not be made perfect.

[1Co 1:9 NASB] God is faithful, through whom you were called into fellowship with His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

[Heb 10:23 NASB] Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful;

[1Jo 1:9 NASB] If we confess our sins, He is faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.
